Rail Supply Group Appoints Leading Industry Experts Jacqueline Starr and Elaine Clark

Today, the <u>Rail Supply Group</u> (RSG) is delighted to announce the appointment of two leading experts to its industry-wide Council, Jacqueline Starr, CEO of the <u>Rail Delivery</u> Group and Elaine Clark, CEO of the <u>Rail Forum Midlands</u>.

Jacqueline Starr became CEO of The Rail Delivery Group (RDG) in December 2020, replacing Paul Plummer. The RDG brings together the companies that run Britain's railway into a single team with one goal – to deliver a better railway. Jacqeline's passion and expertise in bringing the industry together to deliver better customer experience will be central to her role with RSG.

Elaine Clark is CEO of Rail Forum Midlands (RFM), a national industry association based at the centre of one of the largest clusters of rail businesses in the world. With some 250 members, RFM has been leading the Rail Sector Deal 'Midlands Pilots' project, which is specifically designed to encourage SME growth through collaboration and schools engagement.

In 2020, Elaine was instrumental in establishing a series of 'Dragon's Den' style events in which SMEs were given the opportunity to collaborate and respond to clients' needs. Several successful pitches are now being taken forward by clients and RFM is planning further events to address some of the industry's biggest challenges including decarbonisation.

"The Rail Supply Group is driven by accomplished individuals who are ready to use their experience and expertise to implement positive change for the entire rail industry. About her appointment to the RSG Council, Jacqueline Starr, said:

- Jacqueline Starr was appointed to RSG Council in January 2021. She has been Chief Executive Officer for the <u>Rail Delivery Group</u> (RDG) since December 2020, replacing Paul Plumber. Jacqueline joined RDG in 2015 as Managing Director for Customer Experience, then Chief Operating Officer until her present position. Prior to RDG, Jacqueline worked in customer experience for the telecommunications and banking sectors.
- 2. Elaine Clark was appointed to the RSG Council in January 2021. Elaine has been CEO of Rail Forum Midlands (RFM) since 2018 and before that was General Manager. Prior to joining RFM Elaine was part of the team that established the National Skills Academy for Rail bringing her previous expertise as an MD of an SME training provier with the electrical power industry. A Chartered Engineer Elaine also has experience in the chemical and electricity supply industries.
- 3. The Rail Supply Group (RSG) is the leadership body for the UK rail supply sector, whose aim is to strengthen the capability and competitiveness of the UK rail supply chain to grow business at home and abroad.
- The RSG was tasked by Government in 2018 to deliver its <u>Industrial Strategy: Rail Sector</u> <u>Deal</u> and aims to strengthen the competitiveness of the rail supply industry at home and overseas.
- In July 2020, the RSG was invited by Government BEIS and DfT to form a Taskforce to put in place measures to help the industry recover from the Covid-19 pandemic. A series of ACT NOW initiatives harnessing industry-wide support are already supporting recovery.
- 6. RSG's core activities are: Digital Railway; Mobility and Data; Sustainable Railway; and Export and Inward Investment. Overarching themes are: Midlands rail cluster, Skills and People, Productivity.

RSG Council includes Government representatives from the Department for Business, Enterprise and Industrial Strategy and Department for Transport, Sector Deal Industry Champions, co-opted suppliers, trade associations, client representatives and trade union representatives. The secretariat for RSG is provided by the Department for Transport.
