In environmental terms: the railway is a low carbon transport mode; it helps remove unnecessary traffic from urban centres and across arterial routes. As a sustainable mover of both people and goods it directly contributes to improved air quality in towns and cities.

From a societal perspective: the railway connects families, friends and communities; it is an agent of regeneration and urban renewal and contributes to social cohesion by providing access to employment, education, goods and services.

Political leaders may differ in their terminology but all are seeking to see their nations and regions secure the strongest and greenest possible recovery from the pandemic. Rail has a key role to play in supporting these aspirations.
